

Vassilis Lentakis was born in Athens in 1961. He read Classics at the University of Athens and, as a scholarship holder from SSF, at University College London. His doctoral thesis is a historical and literary commentary on Xenophon's *Lakedaimonion Politeia*. His research interests focus on the social anthropology of the ancient world, on the history of sexuality, on the political and social institutions of Athens and Sparta, on the ancient Greek novel, and on the Attic orators. He has published various papers on the above subjects, and has written the following books: Chariton, *Chaireas and Callirrhoe*, introduction and translation (Rodakio, 1995); Pseudo-Xenophon, *Athenaion Politeia*, introduction-translation-commentary (Stigmi, 2010); Lysias, *On the Murder of Eratosthenes – Against Simon*, introduction-translation-commentary (Stigmi, 2015); Demosthenes, *Against Konon*, introduction-translation-commentary (Stigmi, 2018); and, in collaboration with Mike Edwards, Antiphon, *Speeches 1, 5, 6* (Stigmi, to be published soon).
