Evripidis Garantoudis was born in 1964 in Kavala. He studied Modern Greek Philology at the Faculty of Philosophy of the Aristotle University of Thessaloniki. From 1986 to 1989 he taught modern Greek language and literature at the Institute of Byzantine and Modern Greek Studies of the University of Padua. From 1995 to 2003 he taught modern Greek literature at the Philology Department of the Philosophy School of the University of Crete. Since 2003 he has been teaching modern Greek philology at the Philology Department of the Philosophy School of the National and Kapodistrian University of Athens, currently as a Professor. He teaches mainly Modern Greek Literature (19th and 20th century). His research interests focus on the study of modern Greek literature, especially poetry, of the 19th and 20th century and are located in the fields of metrics, literary history and the interpretation of literary texts.
