**Lito Ioakimidou**, born in Athens in 1971, has studied French Language and Literature at the National and Kapodistrian University of Athens. She has a PhD degree in Comparative Literature from the University of Paris IV-Sorbonne (*Myth and Novel in the First Half of the 20<sup>th</sup> Century: Forms and Techniques of the Emergence of the Myth*). She has taught in the School of Social Sciences at the University of Crete (2000-2003), in the Departments of French Studies at the University of Cyprus (2003-2004) and at the Aristotle University of Thessaloniki (2004-2010) and, since 2011, she is Assistant Professor of Comparative Literature in the Department of Philology at the National and Kapodistrian University of Athens.
